Day 1

Alpine Hut Hike:

The day begins with an unforgettable hike in the middle of breathtaking nature. Together, guests explore picturesque trails, enjoy impressive views, and breathe in the fresh mountain air. The route is suitable for all levels – whether beginners or experienced hikers, everyone will find something they like. The destination is an Alpine hut in the mountains.

Lunch Snack at the Hut:

After the hike, a well-deserved lunch awaits at a rustic Alpine hut. Regional specialties are served. The Brettljause (snack platter) includes cheese, sausages, bacon, fresh farmhouse bread, and a homemade apple strudel. In a cozy atmosphere, you can enjoy Carinthian hospitality – with a magnificent view of the surrounding mountains.

Mountain Hut Olympics:

The highlight is an exciting Alpine Hut Olympics competition! Choose from six of the following traditional and fun activities (see pages 5-11). Perfect for team spirit, fun, and unforgettable moments together amidst the mountain scenery!



Day 2 (Part 1)

Mountain Challenge:

If a traditional scavenger hunt is too easy for you, you'll love the Mountain Challenge set in the middle of a breathtaking mountain scenery. The group is divided into teams that complete various stations set up along hiking trails. To find these stations, each team is equipped with a compass, a map, and a road book. The tasks focus on a wide range of skills, giving every team member the chance to showcase their abilities. It's not just fun and tricky challenges that await – dexterity is needed for the trick boxes, and team spirit is essential for building the Leonardo Bridge and setting up tents. Finally, all teams come together at a mountain hut. There, the winning teams are honored, and if desired, a company logo can be created using natural materials. Day 2 (Part 2)

Survival Workshop:

Mountain survival training is a unique challenge. Participants learn techniques for navigating the terrain, making fire without tools, building shelter, and foraging. This is done entirely according to the principle of the five pillars of survival: fire, shelter, water, food, and orientation. At the end of the day, each participant should be able to survive for a certain period of time, even in the wild, far from civilization.

Alpine survival training is a valuable experience that teaches participants a lot about themselves and their abilities. The better the participants work together in teams, the easier the tasks can be mastered.

Afterward, the guests return to the Aldiana Club Schlanitzen Alm.

Cow Milking

"Trudi," our cow, is waiting for you to milk her. You'll need a gentle touch and quick hands to fill the bucket in no time – and to keep "Trudi" from kicking!

Sawing Competition

We're still sawing by hand. But not against the clock; the goal is to saw a 348g piece of wood off our tree trunk as accurately as possible.

Target Throwing

Can throwing isn't just a thing at Oktoberfest, but also at the huts. In addition to strength, aiming skills and accuracy are required to make all the cans fall.

Nail Contest

Take a hammer and nail and try to get the nail into the tree trunk with as few blows as possible. With all your heart and soul, watch your fingers!

Horseshoe Throwing

To achieve the highest possible score in this game, two things are important: talent and luck! The participant who can throw the horseshoe around the iron bar in the middle is the winner.

Beer mug lifting

A traditional activity of the Bavarians, Tyroleans, and Salzburgers. Guests hold the beer mug with one hand for as long as they can.

Reaction Game

Whose reaction is the best? All our sticks come from above, but the question is: Which one will be the next to fall? Participants need good reflexes to catch the sticks and must move quickly in the right direction. This game is fun for everyone!

Course of Trust

Each group member is blindfolded, except for one person. This participant will lead the rest of the team through a predetermined course. An exciting task that increases awareness and builds trust.

Croquet

The goal is to complete our croquet course in as few strokes as possible. The total number of strokes per team is used for scoring.

Alpine Curling

A slightly different form of curling: Instead of a stone, participants use a can filled with water to curl the ball! It's great fun and works on any surface!

Beer Coaster Snapping

The stack of beer coasters is tossed upwards with the back of the hand. After the beer coaster has rotated 180 degrees in the air, it must be caught cleanly with the hand, according to Guinness rules.

Hay Bag Throw

The goal is to throw the hay bag as far as possible and hit the target area. The farther you go, the more points you get.



Team building activities

Remnant Recovery

Each group is asked to use tools to retrieve a repository located in a contaminated area, symbolized by an old alarm clock. No group member is allowed to touch the contaminated soil. The goal is to discuss possible solutions under time pressure and thus achieve success.

Mohawk Walk

Two steel cables are strung approximately 30 cm above the ground at three points, like the letter V. Two participants work together to reach the outermost point as far as possible. While the two participants give their best with concentration and skill, they are encouraged by the other group members.

Spider Web

A spider web made of ropes is strung between two trees, which the participants must cross without touching anything. Each of the fields is used. This cannot be done alone. As the team members help each other, any fear of contact is reduced.



Team building activities

Ball Transport

The group's task is to transport a ball to a specific target using plastic chutes. Each participant has a chute at their disposal, but the distance to the target is longer than expected. Group coordination and communication are trained, and a team is formed.

Focus Ring

The group selects a team captain who gives the necessary instructions for this game. Together, they must transfer a ball placed on one pole to another. Since the team members are not allowed to touch the ball, they are given a ring with strings attached to it. Blindfolded and with the help of the team captain, the ball is then transferred from one pole to the other. This exercise primarily trains active listening.

Tandem Skiing

In tandem skiing, three or four group members stand on an unusual pair of skis. Once in the bindings, you tackle the course we have set for you.



Team building activities

The Magic Polygon

This requires a bit of rethinking! Participants are given the task of creating a specific shape with a rope. It becomes clear that resources are seemingly insufficient – unconventional solutions are needed!

Island Game

The island game is a fun warm-up exercise that challenges every participant. In this activity, the group is tasked with lining up in a circle in a specific order. The difficulty lies in the fact that after the explanation, participants are no longer allowed to speak to each other; only gestures are permitted. Furthermore, they are only allowed to move around a chain of islands arranged in a circle.

Nine Points – One Rope

Think outside the box! The goal is to connect the nine points in a specific way. Sounds simple, but it requires thinking outside the box – which isn't easy for everyone.

How we work

Project management

For the planning, organisation and supervision of the event, we charge a project manager rate of € 850,00 plus VAT per event day. This rate includes 10 hours of project management on the day of the event and 10 hours of preparatory work. In the event that the customer and eventfactory decide that no eventfactory project manager needs to be present during the event, we shall only charge a flat rate organisation fee of € 650,00 plus VAT per event day. For a site inspection, we charge € 495,00 plus VAT per day. A vehicle for on-site travel is included. Expenses will be charged to the client according to consumption.

Further Costs

For additional work, conceptual work, changes as well as other working times, we charge € 55,00 plus VAT. per hour. Tips are generally not included in our costing and are charged by customary in a place.

Confirmation

Generally our offers are non-binding and depending on availability. For a binding confirmation of the contract, please send us the offer and the terms and conditions signed by an authorized officer of the firm. The terms and conditions can be found at <https://www.eventfactory.at/assets/Downloads/EN/Terms-and-Conditions.pdf> at all times. Subsequently, you will receive a first deposit invoice. Together with the consequent receipt of payment, the event is booked bindingly. In case deposits are not fully rendered, we allow ourselves to cancel the event and invoice the cancellation costs after a written reminder and a grace period of 5 days.

Bad weather

In case of bad weather or lack of snow, we will be happy to organize an alternative program for you, which must be fixed at least 3 days before the event. For the alternative program, if not otherwise agreed, the costs of the original program will be charged.

Disclaimer

In any case of extreme weather situations (storms, hurricanes, snow, rain, etc.) or road closures or pandemics eventfactory is not obliged to cover increased costs for the client or in providing an equivalent replacement in such a case. Additional costs will be charged according to expenditure.
